Forward motion has always been our answer to uncertainty—and in 2025, we met the moment with clarity, discipline, and renewed purpose. This year marked a pivotal chapter for Mighty Writers.

With new leadership came a sharpened focus on strengthening our foundation—refining operations, reinforcing financial systems, and building a culture of accountability to support long-term, sustainable growth.

For 17 years, Mighty Writers has served more than 45,000 young people across Greater Philadelphia and New Jersey through free, high-quality writing and literacy programs. But our work extends beyond the page. We create spaces where young people feel safe, seen, and valued—where their voices matter.

In 2025, that impact deepened:

- 90% of students say Mighty Writers is a safe place
- 84% report increased self-kindness (up from 72%)
- 75% report stronger confidence and self-esteem
- 82% are making more positive decisions (up from 70%)
- 70% report improved family relationships
- 82% report stronger peer connections

These outcomes reflect the strength of our whole-child model—where literacy, emotional well-being, and community support work hand in hand.

At the same time, we expanded our reach. Through initiatives like Mighty Writers On the Road and strategic partnerships with schools and community organizations, we are bringing our programming directly into neighborhoods—meeting families where they are and removing barriers to access.

We also continue to address one of the most urgent needs facing our communities. Today, Mighty Writers provides fresh food and essential resources to more than 2,500 families each week across Philadelphia, Chester County, and South Jersey—ensuring that young people have the stability they need to learn and thrive.

While 2025 was a year of alignment, the years ahead will be defined by intentional growth. Our five-year strategic plan is focused on strengthening our operational core, building financial resilience, expanding partnerships, and growing our model into new communities.

As we evolve, we are working toward becoming an intergenerational hub—supporting not only young people, but entire families.


In 2026, we are deepening our impact through:

THE ORGANIZATION

WHO WE ARE

Mighty Writers is a regional nonprofit with a simple, powerful mission: help young people think clearly and write with clarity. Founded in 2009 in a single Philadelphia storefront serving 70 children, Mighty Writers has grown into an eight-site organization reaching nearly 5,000 youth annually across Greater Philadelphia, Chester County, and South Jersey through free, high-quality after-school and summer literacy programs.



We know that children can't think or write clearly when hungry. Understanding that hunger hinders learning, we launched a food distribution program during the COVID-19 pandemic. Today, our distribution program serves 75,000 families annually with culturally relevant food and essential supplies through five hubs and seven pop-up sites.

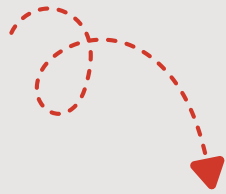

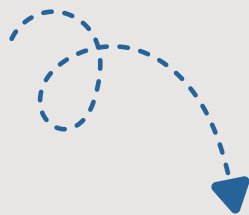

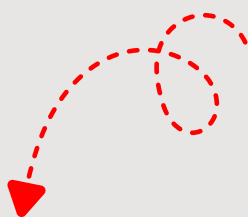

DISTRIBUTION

In 2025, we served over 110,000 families through four on-site food distribution centers and three mobile pop-up locations, reaching families in underserved neighborhoods with limited access to nutritious, affordable food. We distributed more than 2 million pounds of food, including 58,000 prepared meals and lunches, 214,270 units of groceries, and 144,000 boxes of fresh produce—all delivered with dignity, consistency, and cultural sensitivity. Our offerings included fresh fruits and vegetables, frozen meats, seasonal goods, shelf-stable pantry items, and culturally relevant meals that honored the backgrounds of the communities we serve.

We maintained strong partnerships with local food retailers, community-based organizations, and volunteers to ensure timely communication and efficient coordination of food donations. Through regular pop-up food distributions and mobile services, we expanded our reach to families unable to travel to our primary sites.

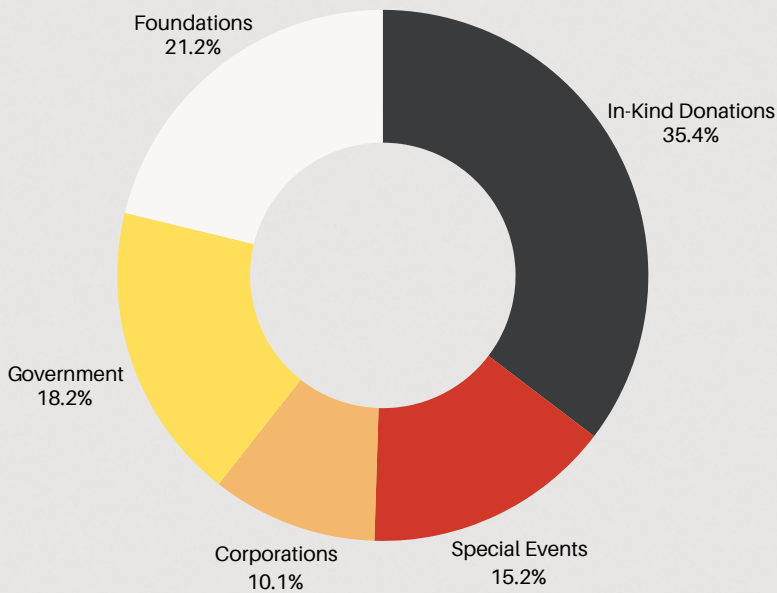

Mighty Writers free programming would not be possible without our financial supporters. Mighty Writers development team maintains a rigorous grants calendar, applying for hundreds of grants to support its varying programs and activities and solicits thousands of generous individuals from across the country.

THE CHALLENGES WE ARE SOLVING

In 2025, Mighty Writers experienced a notable decline in institutional giving, with fewer grants awarded from state agencies, foundations, and corporations.

This decrease was driven in part by an increasingly competitive funding environment. State and federal funding cuts, along with delayed reimbursements from public grants, created a significant mismatch between program delivery and cash receipts, contributing to a projected \$1.9 million budget deficit and an estimated \$2 million cash-flow shortfall tied to reimbursements anticipated through 2027.

As federal funding was cut, delayed, or halted for many organizations, thousands of nonprofits that had previously relied on those sources turned more aggressively to private foundations, corporations, and state-level opportunities to fill urgent gaps. As a result, grant funding pools became significantly more crowded, making it more difficult to secure support even for strong, mission-aligned proposals.

This shift contributed to broader financial pressure across the organization and reinforced the importance of strengthening MW's long-term sustainability strategy. In response, Mighty Writers is working to diversify revenue, deepen donor stewardship, pursue more selective and strategic grant opportunities, and build a more resilient fundraising model that is less vulnerable to volatility in any one funding source

LOOKING AHEAD, MOVING FORWARD

Mighty Writers is enhancing its fundraising model to diversify revenue streams, focusing on over 300 grant prospects and grassroots initiatives like the Annual Literacy Bash. The organization is expanding major gifts and donor engagement while implementing tighter financial controls and planning. Mighty Writers has narrowed its geographic focus by closing sites in Newark and El Paso, yet continues strong operations in Atlantic City, Camden, Philadelphia, and Southern Chester County. In response to community needs, Mighty Writers will open two new food pantries in Atlantic City and West Philadelphia, integrating its mission with literacy and food distribution efforts.

Beginning in 2026, Mighty Writers will also shift its fiscal year from January–December to July–June to better align financial planning with the academic calendar. Together, these steps reflect a disciplined approach to realistic growth, financial resilience, and long-term impact.

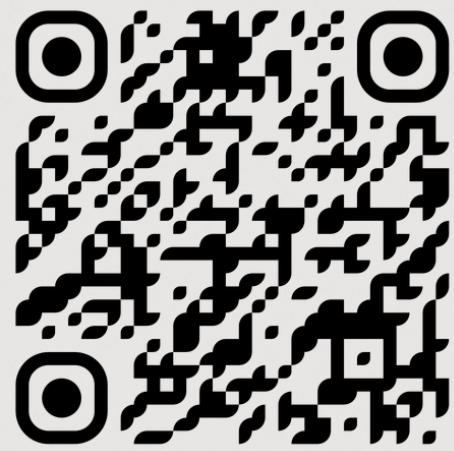
